Native Plants of Maryland By Community/Eco Region

Presenter: Sara Tangren, Ph.D.

In order to successfully design and maintain a natural home landscape, it is crucial to be familiar with the native plants of your area and the combinations in which they occur. While the importance of this understanding may seem obvious, it is often overlooked in traditional gardening instruction. This portion of our program will analyze and illustrate native plant communities that can serve as 'design models' for natural plantings on your property.

Sara Tangren received her Ph.D. in Natural Resources from the University of Maryland in 2001. Her passion is the study of plants native to the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Her company, Chesapeake Native Nursery, is located on a farm in Davidsonville, Maryland, and grows local ecotype flowers and grasses. Dr. Tangren has worked closely with grounds managers and landscapers to bring native plants to the landscapes of parks, non-profits, businesses, cities, schools, college campuses, subdivisions and military bases.

Larry Weaner has been principal of Larry Weaner Landscape Design Associates since 1982 with projects throughout the eastern U.S. He is also active as a guest lecturer for numerous institutions, including the National Arboretum in Washington, DC, and the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center in Austin, Texas. Larry is a past board member and environmental committee chair of the Association of Professional Landscape Designers.

Using a "plant it and they will come" approach to gardening, Adrian will discuss, season by season, the needs of our native fauna. He will explain how specific bird and butterfly species, frogs and turtles and other desirable wildlife can be enticed onto your property through the thoughtful selection and arrangement of plants, wildlife structures and water. This very underutilized and dynamic aspect of landscaping can provide a whole new dimension to your outdoor living experience.

Adrian Binns has combined his lifetime interest in ornithology and wildlife, with his background in landscape design. As an independent tour guide, Adrian has also led birding trips throughout the United States and abroad. As an educator Adrian has lectured, written articles, and produced an educational program on "Owls" for the Audubon Society. He is also an accomplished avian illustrator and photographer, whose images have been published in various publications.
