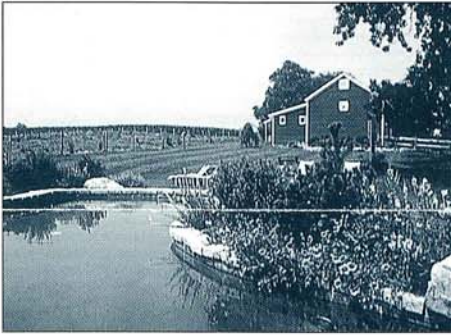


Native Wildflower Meadows and Meadow Inspired Gardens
